



Sports Premium

Background

'Sport Premium' is a funding package that has been allocated to schools by the Government. Following the success of the London Olympics in 2012 the government announced that they would be providing schools with additional money to support the delivery of PE and sports in schools. The money must be used to improve the provision of P.E. and school sport but schools will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

The annual grant for Stockton on the Forest primary school is made up from a base grant of £16,000 plus a further £10 per pupil.

For 2018/2019 the school will receive approximately £16,900.

Provision

At Stockton on the Forest Primary school we recognise the contribution of PE and sports to the health and well-being of children. Through PE and sport, children develop many core values such as discipline, communication, team work, ambition, humility, respect and perseverance. Participation in PE and sports, along with the adoption of a healthy lifestyle can lead to improved concentration, attitude, and academic achievement.

We welcome the additional funding to improve our provision of physical education (PE) and sport and are committed to using this resource to develop high quality PE lessons, alongside providing opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people.

At Stockton on the Forest Primary school we use the funding in the following ways:-

1) To buy in to the York Schools Sports Network

This enables us to

- Provide a lunch time club each week
- Provide play leader training
- Provide staff mentoring
- Provide intra school competition
- Provide sports specific leadership training
- Support staff in their identification and development of gifted and talented pupils
- Provide after school sports clubs
- Monitor the participation and activity levels of children

2) To purchase resources to support the participation of children in sports and healthy activities

This enables us to

- Ensure that children in school have access to a wide range of high quality resources
 - Provide a range of sports and activities for children to participate in and experience
 - Introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- 3) To enrich our sport and healthy living curriculum such as providing after school sports clubs and healthy activities for children**

Impact

The impact of the sports premium at Stockton on the Forest primary school has been that:

- Staff have accessed regular professional development in delivering a quality PE and sports curriculum. They have greater confidence in planning and delivering a wider range of sporting activities.
- The children have participated in intra school competitions
- Children have developed leadership skills
- A greater number of children have been involved in a wider range of clubs and sporting activities
- The school has improved in its PE and sports provision and has achieved the Sainsbury's Games mark at silver level. The school achieved the silver award in the 2017/2018 academic year.
- 73% of Y6 pupils can swim 25metres or further with confidence
- 80% of Y6 pupils can swim using different strokes
- 87% of Y6 pupils have received instruction in safe self-rescue in water based situations through attending the residential.

Sustainability

The mentoring provided through our membership of the York School Sport network is building teacher skills, knowledge and understanding.

The school is currently working on further developing its relationship with local sports clubs such as York City Knights to establish an annual programme of sports provision that we aim to embed into the school's annual calendar.
